

The College's History and Mission

Clinton Junior College was established in 1904 by The African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church. The Church's core mission was to provide an education in the liberal arts tradition to descendants of slaves who had limited or no access to schools or colleges. Clinton students are nurtured in a small school setting, designed

to provide individual attention and mentoring by faculty and staff.

The College is proud of its history of providing a starting point in college for both academically gifted students as well as those that have had challenges that initially obscured their potential to succeed. The graduates of Clinton have gone on to four-year institutions

or on to gainful employment in the work force. A significant number of the alumni have distinguished themselves in the fields of education, religion, medicine, and the arts. Clinton Junior College is accredited by the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools.

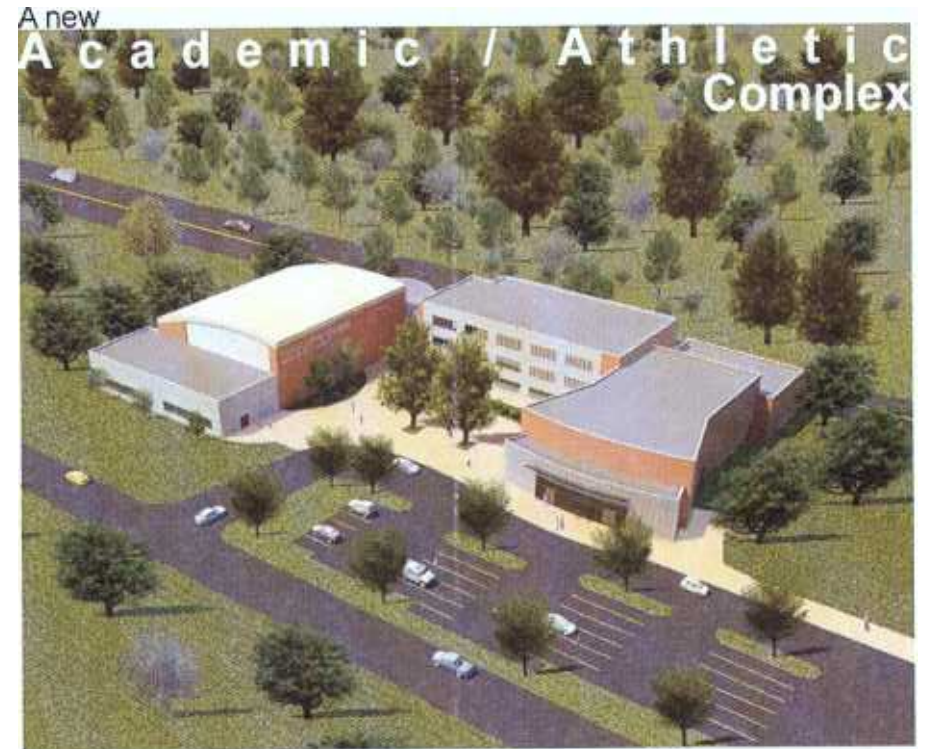

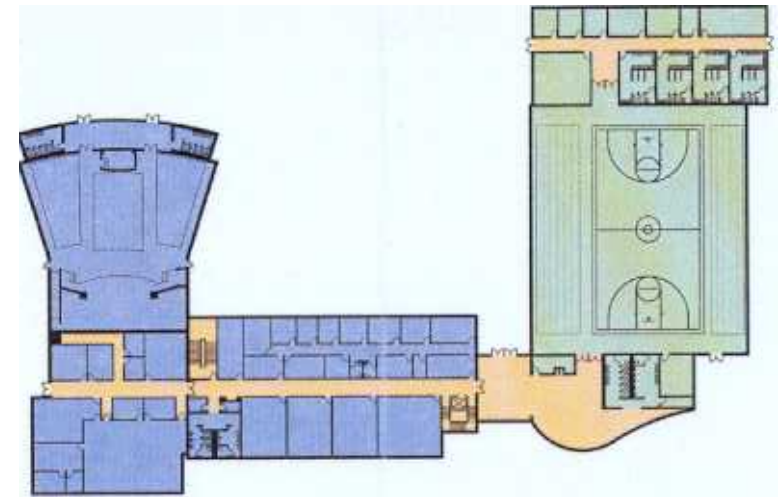
A New Building for Clinton Junior College

The Academic/Athletic Complex will transform the physical environment of the Clinton Junior College campus. The investment of \$15,000,000 in the 63,000 s.f. building will provide a much needed upgrade to current facilities, and move the college more aggressively into the competitive world of 21st Century

higher education. The new building is a multi-functional structure housing most of the College's academic, athletic, and fine arts programs.

The "U" shaped structure is sited adjacent to the College's new library (built in 2004), on vacant land. A central courtyard designed for student/faculty

circulation and interaction is the major organizing feature of the complex. An auditorium and gymnasium anchor two wings, and a three-story classroom/lab/office segment serves as a connector. The Complex is sited so that it is highly visible from Heckle Boulevard and the general community of Reck Hill.

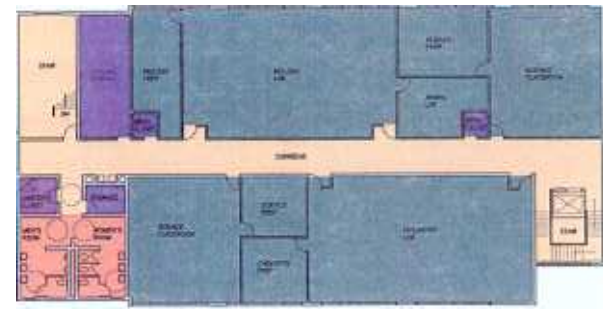
